Back in Thyme Herbals: Ginkgo Biloba

GINKGO BILOBA (Maidenhair Tree)
Ginkgoaceae
Gonko family

Botanists fondly refer to the Ginkgo tree as a living fossil because it is not only the sole survivor of the Ginkgo family but also the oldest living tree species, with a 200-million year history. The trees alive today are almost identical to those in fossil records that predate the evolution of mammals. It is classified in the same group as conifers and cycads, but is distinct from both.

From earliest times the Chinese held the tree in high regard for its medicinal properties. A single species of deciduous tree make up this genus, which is found wild in Zhejiang and Guizhou Provinces, of China and which has no close relatives. Ginkgo Biloba is rare in the wild, with its fan-shaped leaves that resemble those of the maidenhair fern. It first flourished in China and Japan, where it is thought, Buddhist monks deemed it sacred and planted it near their temple.

Western research has concentrated on the leaves while Chinese used the seeds as medicine. They used an extract of the fruit to ward off tuberculosis, the seed kernel for bronchial congestion and kidney infection and an extract of the leaves to treat depression, senility, toxic shock, and circulatory ailments. The Ginkgo was first introduced into America in 1784, not for its medicinal value but as an ornamental tree for a Philadelphia estate. Because the Ginkgo is attractive but nearly impervious to insects, disease, and pollution, it has since become a popular and familiar city tree. Its soft green foliage enhances urban streets in spring, and its golden leaves add ornamental touch in autumn, but unfortunately the rotting fruit of the female tree emits an

offensive odor. They only fruit when male and female are planted together.

Among the plant's main constituents are ginkgolides, which are not known in any other plant species; these are PAF (platelet activating factor) blockers, which inhibit allergic responses. Ginkgo flavonoids appear to be particularly effective in improving the circulation to the brain and the herb is increasingly used in geriatric medicine. Ginkgo comes from the Japanese words *gin*, meaning "silver", and *kyo*, meaning "Apricot". Ginkgo likes fertile, well-drained soil in the sun and they die back if pruned. Leaves are picked as they change color in the fall and are dried for use in distilled extracts, infusions, powders, tinctures, and tablets. Kernels from ripe fruits are cooked for use in decoctions, and are roasted as a snack or garnish, or canned or dried for use in stews, soups, and stir fries. Seeds yield an edible oil.

Ginkgo properties are a bitter-sweet, astringent herb that dilates bronchial tubes and blood vessels, controls allergic responses, and stimulates circulation (leaves); has antifungal and antibacterial effects (seeds). Leaves are used for asthma, allergic inflammation responses, cerebral insufficiency in the elderly, senile dementia, circulatory complaints, such as Raynaud's disease, varicose veins, and irregular heartbeat. Seeds are used for asthma, coughs with thick phlegm, and urinary incontinence.

CAUTION: Excess use may cause dermatitis, headaches, diarrhea, and vomiting.

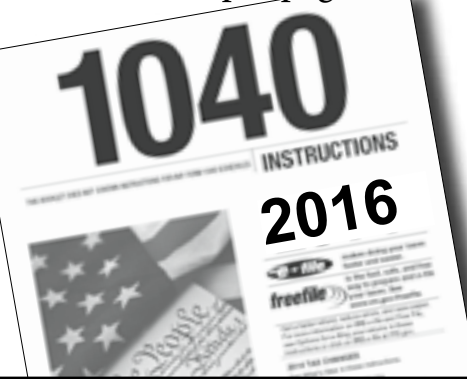

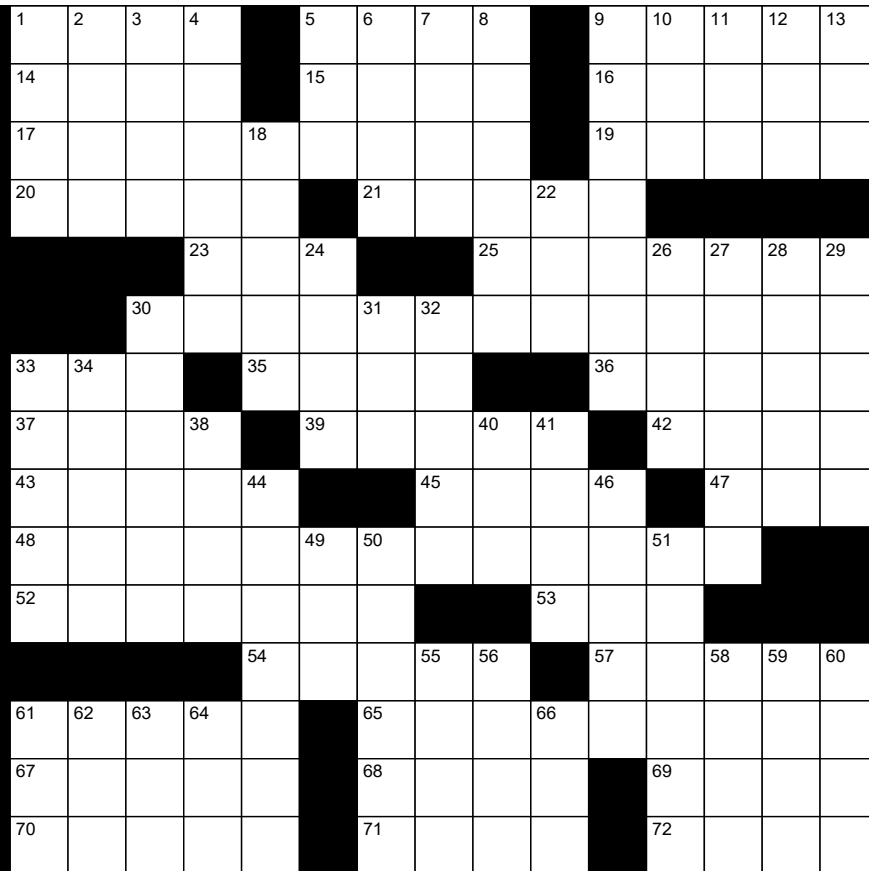

ODFW Announces Free Fishing: April 22 & 23


