Annual CV Music Festival Coming August 12th


Wow, time sure flies! Hope everyone's Refreshment.



Credit Union Coming to Christmas Valley

Federal Credit Unions are not-for-profit cooperative financial institutions that are owned and operated by their members. Through the use of volunteer boards and member ownership, credit unions are able to provide highly competitive loan rates, savings rates and fewer fees than other lending institutions. Credit Unions share profits with their members (not shareholders) through the payment of dividends. Members also maintain voting rights for issues concerning operations and policy.

Just as banks are overseen by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), federally chartered and insured credit unions are overseen by the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA). Just like FDIC, NCUA also provides credit union savings insurance of at least \$250,000 through the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund (NCUSIF), a savings insurance program backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government.

Becoming a member of a credit union generally requires eligibility within the common bond provision, submission of a membership application and the purchase of at least one ownership share.

Back In Thyme Herbals: Essential Oils

I recently went to a class on essential oils, and have found them to be much more convenient to use than just using herbs as they are! Don't get me wrong, I still love to grow and use the herbs in the form of teas, tinctures and infusions. However, there are essential oils that can do wonders for your health, your mood, your stress level and overall well being. If you should choose to try them, please try to find the purest form of oils you can as they are much more effective and safer.

Essential oils are the volatile liquids that are distilled from plants and plant parts such as: seeds, bark leaves, stems, roots, flowers, and fruits. The therapeutic values come from their chemical constituents, which are affected by what part of the plant is used, soil conditions, where they grow, fertilizer (organic or chemical), climate, altitude, harvest season, method of harvest, and distilling process. Different conditions can cause them to be more caustic or irritating to the skin, hence the purer the better the results. Chemists can replicate some of the known individual constituents but it would be impossible, to successfully recreate complete essential oils in the laboratory. Anything less than pure, therapeutic-grade oils may not produce the desired results and can, in some cases, be extremely toxic.

The reason pure oils can be expensive is because it may require several hundred to several thousand pounds of plant material to extract one pound of pure essential oil. The vast majority of oils produced have been for the aromatic qualities only. Unnecessary high pressures and high temperatures, rapid processing and the use of chemical solvents are often used during the distillation process to get a greater quantity of oil, produced at a faster rate.

They small just as good and cost less, but they lack most, if not all of the chemical constituents necessary to produce the expected therapeutic results. The benefits of pure therapeutic grade oils embody the regenerating, protective, and immunestrengthening properties of plants. Essential oil constituents are small in molecular size and lipid soluble, allowing them to *Continues as* **OILS** *on page 21*







Fire on the Mountain

Lightening that accompanied severe weather in the late afternoon/early evening of Thursday, July 24 sparked the Well Fire on the south slopes of Green Mountain. Local crews responded and battled the blaze. The flames were clearly visible from the Christmas Valley township through the night. With support from the Eastern Oregon Task Force, two engines, a helicopter, and a dozer the fire was contained at just 75 acres.



Fire Danger "Extreme" - Restrictions Apply

The fire danger level was elevated to Restrictions: "Extreme" July 28, 2017. Additionally the Industrial Fire Precaution Level (IFPL) was increasing to Level 3 within lands under the South Central Oregon Fire Management Partnership and Public Use Restrictions are also being implemented in several areas.

Both the IFPL 3 and Public Use Restrictions went into effect at 12:01 a.m. Friday, July 28, 2017. Under IFPL 3, personal use woodcutters are prohibited from operating power saws, per the rules and regulations issued with the permit.

Public Use Restrictions are being implemented on lands administered by the Fremont-Winema National Forest, Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Lakeview District and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Sheldon-Hart Mountain National Wildlife Complex and Klamath Basin National Wildlife Refuge Complex.

The only Lakeview District BLM lands not included in this are those within the Klamath Falls BLM Resource Area west of Langell Valley. This area is under the protection of the Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF). For information on specific restrictions in areas under ODF's fire protection, please visit the website:

Personal and commercial woodcutters are reminded of their responsibility to stay informed of current IFPLs and all restrictions that apply to activities conducted on public lands. Failure to comply with the fire precautionary requirements may result in a violation notice.



- Motorized vehicles can only be operated on roads clear of flammable vegetation and parking off roadways must be done in areas barren of flammable material.
- Chain saw use is prohibited, portable generators can only be used in designated areas and spark arresters are required on any internal combustion engine being operated.
- Welding or operating an acetylene or other torch with an open flame is also prohibited.
- Anyone entering federal lands under these restrictions must also carry a shovel at least 26 inches long with a blade no less than 8 inches wide, an axe or Pulaski with at least a 26-inch handle and a head weight no less than 2 pounds, and at least 1 gallon of water or a 2.5 pound fully charged fire extinguisher.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment of not more than 6 months, or both.





tions. However, visitors should be aware of current conditions and the potential for restrictions in Wilderness Areas as fire season continues.

The South Central Oregon Fire Management Partnership is an interagency fire management program that provides comprehensive wildland fire service to south central Oregon and northwest Nevada. The partnership strives to achieve a more efficient, effective and integrated interagency fire management program for all participating agencies on the lands administered and protected by each agency.

Participating agencies include: Fremont-Winema National Forest, Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Lakeview District, Sheldon-Hart Mountain National Wildlife Refuge Complex, Klamath Basin National Wildlife Refuge Complex, Crater Lake National Park and Klamath-Lake District Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF).


