
Not everything can go in all the time, but most things submitted in a usable format do find a place in DESERT WHIS-PERS in one form or another.





# Healthy Meals Enhance Learning at School

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. North Lake School District #14 offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$2.25, (Elementary & High School) lunch costs \$2.50 (k-6), \$2.75 (7-12), & \$3.75 (for adults). Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.00 for breakfast and \$0.00 for lunch.

- 1. Should I fill out an application if I got a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free meals? Please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school (541-576-2121) if you have questions.
- 2. Do I need to fill out an application for each child? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: North Lake School.
- 3. Who can get free meals? Children in households getting Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, TANF or FDPIR can get free meals regardless of income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Guidelines.
- **4. Can foster children get free meals?** Yes, foster children who are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court can get free meals. Any foster child in the household can get free meal regardless of income.
- 5. Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals? Please contact North Lake School to see if your child(ren) qualifies, if you have not been informed that they will get free meals.

household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Income Chart

- 7. If my child is eligible for free or reduced price meal benefits, when will the meal benefits begin? Meal benefits for new applications cannot start until an application is approved. Please provide a lunch or money for a paid lunch until you receive notice that the application is approved.
- 8. I get WIC. Can my child(ren) get free **meals?** This can only be detemfined by completing and submitting the enclosed application for meal benefits. Please fill out an application.
- 9. My children receive Oregon Health Plan benefits. Can they get free meals? This can only be determined by completing and submitting the application for meal benefits. Please fill out an applica-
- 10. Will the information I give be checked? Yes, we may ask you to send written proof.
- 11. If I do not qualify now, may I apply later? Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year.
- 12. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing.
- 13. May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen? Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- 14. Who should I include as members of my household? You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends). You must include yourself and all children who live with you. Foster children may be included as household members. If you live with other people who are economically independent (for example, people you do not support, who do not share income with you or your children and who pay a prorated share of expenses), do not Include
- 15. What if my income is not always the same? List the amount that you normally get. For example, if you normally get \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only got \$900, put down that you get \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but not if you get it only sometimes.

# **New Bill Increases Age to Purchase Tobacco**

On August 10, 2017 Oregon Governor Kate Brown's signing of a new law that raises the required minimum age to legally buy or obtain tobacco products from 18 to 21 caps a year-long celebration of 20 years of tobacco prevention successes in the state.

Brown signed SB 754, known as Tobacco 21 and recently passed by the Oregon Legislature, making Oregon the fifth state to increase the age to purchase tobacco, after California, Hawaii, Maine and New Jersey. The new law takes effect immediately, with enforcement and fines to begin Jan. 1, 2018.

"The passage of Tobacco 21 is a tremendous accomplishment for public health in this state, and the young people of Oregon," said Oregon Health Authority Public Health Division Director Lillian Shirley. "Tobacco 21 is an evidence-based strategy that will help reduce youth initiation of tobacco. We know that most addiction to tobacco starts in adolescence—in fact, nine of 10 adults who smoke report that they started smoking before they turned 18, and almost 100 percent start before they turn 26."

She added, "We need to protect kids with laws such as Tobacco 21 because new marketing tactics and products with hookahs, e-cigarettes and flavored vaping products put a new generation at risk of addiction."

There's still work left to be done in Lake County. There are tobacco prevention

challenges in Lake County to help prevent future generations from starting to use tobacco. Cigarette smoking among pregnant women in Lake County is 20%. This is about twice as high in Oregon overall and the rest of the United States. Among 11th graders in Lake County non cigarette tobacco use is 60% higher than cigarette smoking. We want Lake County to be OUTBACK STRONG! Healthy Babies! Healthy Children! Healthy Everyone!

# What the law means for retailers and certified smoke shop owners:

Currently, there is no violation for people ages 18, 19, or 20 to possess tobacco products or inhalant delivery systems. Enforcement will take place at the retail locations that sell these products:

Effective immediately, retailers and certified smoke shops can no longer sell tobacco products, inhalant delivery systems, or tobacco delivery systems to people younger than 21. There are no exceptions for sales and use of tobacco or inhalant delivery systems to persons under 21 years of age.

Retailers and certified smoke shops that sell tobacco products or inhalant delivery systems are required to display a sign stating the prohibition of tobacco product or inhalant delivery system sales to persons younger than 21. Failure to post a sign stating this would be a Class A violation.

Enforcement of this law goes into effect Jan. 1, 2018.

- 16. We are in the military; do we include our housing allowance? If you get an off-base housing allowance, it must be counted as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income.
- 17. My spouse is deployed to a combat zone. Is combat pay counted as income? Combat pay is excluded if it is received in addition to the service member's basic pay, because of the deployment, and not received before being deployed.
- 18. My family needs more help. Are there other programs we might apply for? To find out how to apply for [State SNAP] or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or Text "FOOD" to 877877 or call 1-866-348-6479 or visit: www.summerfoodoregon.org/.



# **Playing with "Monopoly Money"**

Once upon a time people exchanged their goods and services for the goods and services others could give them. We call this bartering. The parties involved had to agree that the exchanged items had roughly equal value. Later, people made coins and bills valued according to a set standard. Later, they backed their currency with gold or silver, which at least tended maintain the values of coins and bills. In eleventhcentury China someone had a brainstorm. The government issued money that had value simply because the emperor said so. With this system a yen (or whatever) had no official fixed value. It simply bought what merchants would let it buy. That kind of money has a name, fiat money. The word fiat comes from Latin meaning "Let it be done," or "It shall be done."

Funny money came to the United States when the colonies issued "notes of credit." Colonists could use these to pay their taxes. Knowing the value of their taxes, people began to use these notes as currency for other payments or purchases. However, when the United States issued its money, each dollar had fixed value in gold. People used the bills understanding they could redeem them for gold if they wished.

Fortunately, this epidemic of "pretend" money did not spread widely until the twentieth century. By then, the governments of most nations controlled issuing money. Then wars such as World War I made it impossible to actually redeem money. Governments found excuses to simply print more as they needed it. In pre-World-War II Germany this practice made shopping difficult. Prices inflated so much that to make a few simple purchases at the grocery, the shopper needed a wheelbarrow full of German marks.

Today our country operates with play, or monopoly money. During a time of crisis the government can and does print

more money and put it into circulation. We take it on faith that a dollar is a dollar. Sometimes we don't notice when that dollar buys less and less, but it happens. As a kid I paid a nickel for a candy bar. What can you buy for a nickel today? That's inflation that sneaks up on us. Then there's the inflation that we never see when shopping. Think of all those jars with convex bottoms or the shrinking size of an ice cream carton.

Government and businesses take money on faith. Tight credit recently meant little money for anybody to borrow or invest. Once again we face national unbudgeted emergencies. And once more we hear threats of government shutdowns in the future. The simple answer: print more. Now we think it worked! Balance the federal budget? What's wrong? Can't the printing presses keep up with the demand? Who knows, maybe the deficit is as imaginary as all that play money. Meantime we're all stuck in the game of pretend. Ain't it fun?

(**Note**: This is not a scholarly look at the problem, but it's the author's take on an insoluble situation.)






