

BLM Announces Public Meeting on Sage-Grouse

The Bureau of Land Management will host a public meeting to solicit comments and provide information on Greater Sage-Grouse land management issues. As stewards, the BLM manages public lands for the benefit of current and future generations, supporting conservation as we pursue our multiple-use mission. The meeting will be held on November 7th, 2017 in Burns, Oregon at the Harney County Community Center, 484 N Broadway Avenue from 5 - 8

The meeting will begin with an overview followed by an open house. Participants will be encouraged to speak with BLM staff on various topics related to the Greater Sage-Grouse. In addition to comments on the issues and planning criteria, the BLM would like to receive comments on whether the planning effort should occur through state-by-state amendment processes and decisions.

In accordance with the October 11, 2017 Notice of Intent, the BLM seeks comments on the Sagebrush Focal Area designation, mitigation standards, lek buffers, disturbance and density caps, adaptive management, and any other topics identified at the state or local level. The potential planning effort does not preclude the BLM from addressing issues and inconsistencies through other means, including policy, training, or plan maintenance, nor does it commit the BLM to amending some, all, or none of the Greater Sage-Grouse plans.

Participants will have the opportunity to provide written comments during the meeting, online at: http://bit/ly/GRSGplanning. Comments can also be submitted via email at: BLM_sagegrouseplanning@blm.

The BLM manages more than 245 million acres of public land, the most of any federal agency. This land is primarily located in 12 Western states, including Alaska. The BLM also administers 700 million acres of sub-surface mineral estate throughout the nation. The BLM's mission is to manage and conserve the public lands for the use and enjoyment of present and future generations under our mandate of multiple-use and sustained yield.



Back in Thyme Herbals: Making Herbal Sachets

Christmas is just around the corner. Some of you may want to give your friends and loved ones a special handmade gift this year. Herbal sachets and pillows are easy to make and are so good for you, health-wise. They make the perfect gift.

Start by finding some gauze, linen, or cheesecloth. You need a fabric that will let the aroma out. Measure squares about 5 inches around and firmly sew three sides together, leaving one side open for filling with your favorite herb or combination of herbs. Use crumbled herbs, not powdered. Stuff the sachet pouch as full as possible. Sew up the open end. For sleep mixtures, to put under a pillow, add a few drops of rose oil or lavender oil. This will keep the herbs from crackling inside it. Make an outside cover as attractive as you want using cotton, linen, silk, or any other fine fabric through which the scents can pass. Choose soft colors, plains or prints, or even embroider your own design. The advantage of the slip cover is that it can be easily washed and changed so it doesn't disturb the herbs inside.

Basic herbs for scented cushions are peppermint, sage, lemon balm, and lavender, to which you can add dill, thyme, marjoram, woodruff, angelica, rosemary, bergamot and lemon verbena. Actually, any scent you enjoy or that relaxes you, can be added. Get creative with your aromas to make the smell you like! Headache cushions use equal amounts of peppermint, spearmint and eau-de-cologne mint with bergamot, and one tablespoon of crushed orris root as the fixative. Fill the cheesecloth, or muslin and use a slip cover of soft green printed cotton. The color will enhance the soothing nature of the cushion.

A simple cushion of hop cones sprinkled with a few drops of vodka makes a good little pillow for those who cannot sleep or who suffer from asthma. For a lovely scented lemon cushion, mix one part each of lemon balm, costmary and lemon thyme with two parts lemon verbena for a nice fresh scent. Add a trace of valerian if you like, but not so much that it overpowers the other scents. For spice scented cushions, use equal quantities of rose petals, rosemary and spearmint with a few crushed cloves. You can make your

cushions look like hearts, diamonds, alphabet letters or any shape you desire.

In the past, these little cushions were often used in dresser drawers, on linen stacks, or just on the shelves for fresh aromas in the room. I remember them around our house when growing up, and how the house always smelled good, and kept away musky smells. They can also work for moth control. My mom would put one in her bath once in a while to help her skin and to relax her!

I hope some of you have fun creating them. They can really improve one's moods, given the right mixture of herbs!


Mercy Flights Prepared For Second Year

Lake County Mercy Flights has made 30 emergency air ambulance flights from July 22 of last year to the present, the board of directors was told Monday, June 12, by the president. Choc Shelton, at the corporation's annual meeting at the Conn & Lynch law offices. Shelton was re-elected president, Dr. William Strieby, vicepresident, and T. R. Conn, secretary. The board elected Dick Lennie treasurer and Jim Lampkins, assistant treasurer. Other board members are Carter Fetsch and Alan Withers.

Shelton said the flights were made as far south as Phoeniz. Ariz., and north as far as Portland, with many to points in between. Most of the patients were members, who can fly a maximum of 400 miles without charge, but Mercy Flights realized \$2200 income from non-members who are charged \$1 per mile. Membership is now about 1025, and with the annual payment date coming up on August 1, renewal payments are being received at the Chamber of Commerce office at the rate of 25 to 35 per day. Initial membership and dues for a year is \$20, and the subsequent annual fee is \$10. New memberships, now restricted to Lake County, are coming in almost every day.

About 100 hours flying time has been put on the plane, and it is in first class condition with new radio, de-icing equipment and other improvements. A hangar for the plane has been built at the airport, and no major expenses are seen for the future.

The Grand Opening of the Christmas Valley Library was held Oct. 5 from 2-6 P.M.

Commissioners Jim Ogle, Harold Gipson and Art Sheer were present along with the Lake County Library Board members Ellen Withers, Don Liddycoat, Jess Knaught, Stan Wonderley, Sally Fitzgerald and Laura Parks. Also present were librarians Alene Schultz of Paisley, Delia Mae Lowe of Silver Lake, Vema Price of Lakeview and Barbara Remy of Christmas Valley.

The Christmas Valley Friends of the Library planned the celebration and supplied the food and helped hostess the event. The Christmas Valley librarian reported 63 people signed the guest book.

Christmas Valley Park & Recreation District bought the building from the Rajneeeh in June of 1986 for \$10,000. In the interim, the building has been put permanently in place and improvements made to bring it up to code. The Park & Recreation District also supplies heat and electricity while the county library supplies the librarian, phone and supplies as the book drop and shelving.

Library hours are Monday 1-5 p.m., Wednesday 10-3 p.m., Friday 1-5 p.m. and Saturday 1-3 p.m.

Grand Opening: North Lake Health Center

A dream came true for many folks when our new North Lake Health Center building was dedicated on October 11, 2007. Alan Parks, Chairman of the Board of North Lake Health District, gave opening remarks and introductions. This new facility serves a medically underserved Frontier area of approximately 250 sq. miles. From the Health Center it is approximately 100 miles to the nearest hospital. He spoke about how this facility will help people remain in the community who might otherwise have to move away for their medical care. It has become part of the infrastructure supporting a local economy, and can grow as the community increases.

Set under brisk fall weather before an outdoor dais, speakers included Dr. Bruce Carlson, MD who leases the clinic and manages it; Paul McGinnis of the Oregon Rural Practice-Based Research Network who was instrumental in providing early support for health care in rural Lake County; Commissioner Brad Winters of Lakeview who offered encouragement and support; Shilo Spurlock of South Central Oregon Economic Development Department was the grand administrator for the federal block grant, matching funds, and funding from the private foundations; and Carl Shumway, Board Vice President and Chairman of the Building Committee who worked with the architect and contractor to see the building to completion.

Many local people were mentioned for their role in making this project happen. Some of them are no longer with us. Margaret Spry was one of the first persons to promote the idea of a local health care provider, and she gave half the land where the Health Center now stands. Kathy Cornell provided early inspiration and direction. Judy Lynch had a clear vision of what was needed and helped carry the workload. Former Board Members Teressa Foster and Patsy Carlon were always there to provide support and direction. Current Board Members Alice Dinsdale and Kathie Weaver helped carry this project to completion.



For the ODF Klamath-Lake District, just about half of the total number of fire starts came from numerous summer lightning storm events. The other half were human caused ignitions.

Fire managers from the Klamath-Lake District, Oregon Department of Forestry [ODF], in cooperation with other local wildland fire agencies and structural fire departments, would like to remind the public that just because fire season has been terminated, fire starts and spread may still occur under the right conditions. Please continue to use fire safe practices all year-round.

The ban on Open Debris burning in Klamath and Lake Counties is being lifted. Check with your local rural structural fire district for burning and permit regulations within their districts and ALSO the county health departments for air quality restrictions.

Debris Burning Reminders:

- Burn only during daylight hours.
- · Burn in cleared areas.
- Burn in 'no wind' conditions (0-7 mph).
- Burn only when meeting Air Quality guidelines.
- Burning of large slash piles should be delayed until more moisture has hit the area.
- Burn only when a responsible person can be in attendance with a shovel and water supply.

Landowners need to remember that any burning escaping their control is their liability and they could be billed for any fire suppression costs. Be cautious, be fire safe.

The Oregon Department of Forestry, Klamath-Lake District, do not issue or require burn permits on lands solely protected by them when fire season is not in effect. Please be aware that a PDM is still required for all harvest activity burning.

ODF: Fire Season Ends in Road/Trail Closures Lifted

Fremont-Winema National Forest

All trails and roads closed on the Klamath Falls Ranger District of the Fremont-Winema National Forest during the Blanket Creek and North Pelican Fires are open.

"Because of the hazardous conditions created by these wildfires, it was imperative to restrict public access to those areas," said Klamath District Ranger Heather Berg. "Some smoke or burning roots may still be visible, but we're confident these hot spots will not threaten the fire perimeters. When traveling through recently burned areas, take great care to be aware of tree snags, debris, stump holes, and possibly flash flooding during heavy rains."

Due to the Blanket Creek Fire, Trail 3703 was closed on September 24. Also, Forest Service Roads 3282, 3228, 3208 and 3134 had restricted access. The same day, in the North Pelican Fire area, Forest Service Roads 3519, 3500350, 3556, 3651, and 3659, as well as Trails 3709, 3710, and 3762 were closed.

This rescinds the following Closure Orders: 06-02-13-17-12, 06-02-13-17-13, and 06-02-13-17-14.




