





Then, the good life kind of fell apart. At 34 years of age I tried salvaging my future by enlisting in the U.S. Army. My military experience only lasted 86 days. It was a medical issue that sent me home, but my discharge was termed "uncharacterized."

I bounced around for several months, not having any real place to call home, but settled in North Dakota near a buddy I'd met in Basic Training. Slowly, the good life returned. I was again making good money, I had a home, and a group of people I called friends. I weathered five winters in North Dakota before life took another turn.

Within a period of a few months, a significant relationship ended, I lost my good job, I became homeless, and I was in an auto accident that totalled my car. I packed what few possessions I had left into a backpack and bought a one-way train ticket to Everett, Washington. I crossed over on the ferry to Whidbey Island, where I'd decided to start my life over. I probably should not have been surprised, but it didn't work out as I had planned.

Yada, yada, yada...

Five years ago I was a homeless guy. The next year I was the editor of the best paper in the county. Now, I'm an educational assistant, moving towards getting my certification to be a substitute teacher. Where will I be in five more years? I don't know. I have plans, but I don't know.

Proverbs 16:9 says, "In his heart a man plans his course, but the Lord directs his steps."

The point is, there are life changes, successes and failures. And, I have security in knowing that ultimately I am not in charge. There is peace in knowing that.







Policy: Animals on Park and Rec Properties

North Lake Park and Rec

North Lake Park and Recreation District has adopted a policy concerning pets/animals on Park and Rec properties. This policy is an attempt to keep our facilities an enjoyable place for all users.

Weather Related Late Starts at North Lake

Superintendent David Kerr

With winter already upon us we will eventually have decisions to make on weather closures, driving conditions, overall safety concerns and possibly 2 hour delays.

Our process when weather is a concern:

- 1. We have staff members drive in to school from Christmas Valley, Fort Rock and Silver Lake at 4:30 a.m.
- 2. By 5:00 a.m. we meet to discuss road conditions. Jo Tuttle has already checked with the County Road crew and based on conditions, a decision will be made to conduct a regular school day, cancel school for the day OR conduct a 2-hour delay.

If we cancel school, you will receive an auto call from our School Messenger system prior to 5:30 a.m. in most cases.

If we conduct a 2-hour delay:

- 1. This allows the road department to clear or sand roads to allow for safer travel for our buses and private vehicles.
- 2. On Mondays buses will run ONE additional hour later (we are already on a one-hour late start on Mondays).
- 3. On Tuesday-Wednesday-Thursday buses will run 2-hours late.

On all days buses will get students to school between 9:30 and 9:45 a.m. to allow students a late breakfast. Classes will start at 10:00 a.m.

Immunization Deadline For Oregon Students

Oregon law requires every child in school to have up-to-date shots unless he/ she has an exemption from a physician or an exemption by Vaccine Education Module, through the Oregon Health Authority.

Vaccine requirements change by grade and by age. A child who was up to date on their shots last year may no longer be up to date. The school will be sending out letters to parents in December if they have children who are not up to date in our records.

The school must report to the health department, all students who are not up to date on immunizations by January I?*" 2018. The health department will then start the exclusion order process and unless your child is up to date with their shots by February 21, 2018, they will be excluded from school.


presents to the children around the world. For YOU are the new Santa, and THAT Henry is why you are so much different from the root of the willow."
