<u> Christmas Valley Water System "Outstanding"</u>

During October of last year, the Oregon Health Authority conducted a drinking water survey of the Christmas Valley Domestic Water System. The results, just now released, show the local water system achieved the superior "Outstanding Performance" level.

The Oregon Health Authority drinking water program has identified criteria for determining whether a community public water system should be considered to have outstanding performance. This designation is given at the completion of a water system survey, formerly referred to a sanitary survey. A water system survey is an on-site review of a system's sources, treatment, storage facilities, distribution system, operation and maintenance procedures, monitoring, and management, for the purpose of evaluating the system's

capability of providing safe water to the public. Systems that are designated outstanding performers will have their water system survey frequency reduced from every 3 years to every 5 years.

The criteria for outstanding performance are:

- 1) No Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL), Action Level, or Treatment Technique violations in the last 5 years;
- 2) No more than one Monitoring and Reporting violation in the last 3 years. The one violation must be resolved (results submitted):
- 3) No significant deficiencies or rule violations identified during the current water system survey; and
- 4) Has not had a waterborne disease outbreak attributable to the water system in the last 5 years.





Taken From The Top "Summer Is Icumen In"

The title above marks the first words of a traditional medieval round sung in Great Britain. For the singers, the cuckoo announced summer's arrival. Most Christmas Valley dwellers celebrate summer by checking the pivot, but we too celebrate.

We say summer begins officially with the summer solstice—the day when the earth's axis is tipped most directly toward the sun—and first cutting looms in the near future. This usually happens between June 21 and June 24. However, Europeans often call it Midsummer's Day. In Finland, on Midsummer's Day the sun does not go down at all, leading to celebration throughout the night hours.

The peoples of Europe have always celebrated what they often call midsummer. When Christianity came, missionaries and priests turned the attention to Saint John the Baptist and observed it as Saint John's Eve. However, much of the celebration has not changed. All over the world, even today we find people building bonfires and jumping over them. The common superstition—those who jump over the fires will

marry in the following year. These customs spread to Latin America with the colonists—although south of the equator they observe the day during their winter—our summer months.

In Twelfth-Century England, boys burned bones and other rubbish, hoping to drive out the dragons that they believed came out on St. John's Eve. They also rolled wheels, symbolizing the sun's turning. During the 1300s women in Cologne France washed their hands and arms in the Rhine on St. John's Eve. They believed the river would wash away the calamities of the coming year.

Folklore also holds that certain herbs harvested at the summer solstice have greater healing power. Likely this tradition gave the herb Saint John's Wort its name.

Most of us make no special celebration at the summer solstice, and the semi-pagan practices have faded from American memories. However, we still celebrate the advent of summer. Often on Memorial Day we focus on the "official start of summer" more than on the veterans the day celebrates. July 4 also functions as a summer celebration.

Around here, of course, spending the night on a hay baler is the most common rite of summer. We celebrate alfalfa growing, alfalfa harvesting—the final cutting! Long may it wave.

Crack in the Ground is a volcanic fissure over two miles long and up to 70 feet deep, located inside of the Four Craters Wilderness Study Area in Northern Lake County; about 8 miles north of Christmas Valley, Oregon. This location is accessed via a rugged dirt road, but passenger cars can make it.

Latitude: 43°19'57.94"N Longitude: 120°40'33.81"W

Sagebrush and juniper cover the high desert surrounding lava flows and cinder cones. The length of the fissure can be hiked, as there is an established trail along the fissure's bottom. Normally, fissures like this one are filled in with soil and rock by the processes of erosion and sedimentation, but because Crack in the Ground is located in such an arid region, very little filling has occurred. As a result, Crack in the Ground exists today nearly as it did shortly after its formation. The bottom of the crack can be as much as twenty degrees below the surface temperature.





Back in Thyme Herbals: **The Magic of Seeds**

In the old days people would grow crops for the seeds to share country-wide to feed numerous populations, thus creating seed banks. As time went on, the government forbade some seed growing unless you belonged to certain organizations that specialized in such seeds for commercial crops. The value of seeds for many purposes has increased immensely!

"...and give us seed, that we may live, and not die, that the land be not desolate."

- Genesis 47:19

The first seed farm was established near Philadelphia by David Landreth, in 1784. From then to now, pungent and aromatic seeds have been employed for many purposes, generally as flavoring in cooking. In ancient times Parkinson wrote, "Caraway is much used to be put among baked fruit, or into bread, cakes, etc., to give them relish."

Fenugreek seeds are used as a condiment in Egypt, and in curries in India. The people of India make a gruel of seeds with sugar and milk. In Mexico, cumin seed is highly valued as an ingredient in chili powders, and the flavor of coriander seed, is a favorite among South Americans, who use it in almost all of their dishes. Fennel was popular with early Romans, who munched the stalks and crowned their warriors with garlands of the leaves. They also used the ground, flavorful seeds too improve the taste of unpleasant medicines. Fennel is now widely used in cookery, and to flavor absinth and other liqueurs. In many parts of the world, people still use seeds as a part of domestic remedies.

Orientals enjoy chewing cardamon seeds to sweeten their breath and for relief from stomach acid. Anise is a valued diuretic, carminative and pectoral. Barley is a strengthening aid in convalescence. Caraway is for upset stomach and gas. Celery is for rheumatism. Burdock seed teas are believed to purify the blood and eliminate or prevent sties and boils. Charles H. Coleman wrote an article in the American Mercury in Feb. 1960, entitled "Seeds That Heal," about men of science discovering

and extracting substances in seeds, that may prove valuable as ingredients in many modern medicines. It mentioned research scientists Bianco Magno and Paolo Rovesti, of the Institute for Research on vegetable derivatives in Milan, Italy, take a pile of shelled corn, to which they add water. The grains begin to sprout (without soil they cannot grow), and after germination they make their extractions with a special press with an enormous amount of pressure, squeezing out every drop of the juices, leaving the remains of the seed-hence a dry pomace. Dermatologists have indicated that these juices stimulate and nourish the skin. Consequently, a special cosmetic is made from these juices, the pomace, an antibiotic, and an anti-oxidant.

There are many vitamins in different germinated seed juices. Lupin juice contains vitamin A, the vitamin which is necessary for the health of the eyes and skin. Wheat juice for vitamin E to benefit the heart and reproductive system. Barley juice for vitamin B1, responsible for the health of the nerves and as a preventative of beriberi. It is further said these seeds also contain niacin and vitamin C. Not all varieties of corn contain the same beneficial agents. Maize, a sugary corn contains more niacin than starchy varieties. During tests of Bengal gram, mung, pea, cowpea, Kalai, rice and wheat, it was shown they produce more niacin, making the juice more beneficial. It was also found that Sunflower seeds contain the most B1, and along with barley and wheat seeds, they also contain the most niacin. The highest riboflavin was released by soybean seedsa vitamin essential to a child's growth and necessary for the health of skin and eyes.
