Christmas Valley Golf Course is OPEN

The Christmas Valley Golf Course is managed by the North Lake Park and Recreation District. The district maintains the course and other properties through taxes generated only from residents of the township of Christmas Valley, greens fees, advertising revenue from the Desert Whispers newspaper, and Contributions from donors and volunteers

Annual memberships for individuals and families are offered, as are daily greens fees. Christmas Valley resident and non-resident fees are the same. These memberships and fees are crucial to our operations and we are grateful for your support. The District Board asks that all players who pay for these services encourage non-paying players to contribute their fair share, as well.

Off-season daily greens fees have been reduced from \$15 to \$10 per day. Off-season is November 1st to April 1st.

A Two-Man Scramble Tournament: is planned for the first weekend in July. A barbecue follows the tournament. Details will be in the June Desert Whispers.

Volunteers have suggested a "Ladies' Day" event. Watch for more information.

And, if there is adequate interest, let's plan a "Clean-up Day" with a barbecue to follow.

The Million Page Challenge is open to people of all ages. Materials read (or listened to) must be owned by a library to count, so get to a library today to prepare for the start date. If no library has reached a million pages by March 31, the library with the most pages read wins. The top 10 readers in Lake County will also receive small prizes.

To join, stop by your local library to pick up a book mark to track your reading – or keep track yourself on any old piece of paper. Books, magazines, newspapers, e-books, and audiobooks checked out from the library all count. Items you purchase yourself do not count. Participants will need to record the title and number of pages they read or listen to. To count audiobook and ebook “pages,” library staff can help you look up the number of pages of a print book of the same title. Pages can be turned in any time at any Lake County Library District location.

VERTIGO

Back in Thyme Herbals: Vertigo

I recently had a friend tell me she was suffering from vertigo. She didn't really know what to do about it, so I decided to look it up since I wasn't sure exactly what it was and what it's causes were.

In the Dictionary of Modern Herbalism by Simon Y. Mills, it is explained as dizziness - a disturbance in the balance mechanism of the middle ear, brought on by the loss of blood supply to the area; it is associated with the loss of fluid electrolites often through excessive sweating. Sometimes related to the sudden rises in hot weather, more chronically, with arteriosclerosis and high blood pressure and may also follow middle ear problems, Menier's disease, migraines or epilepsy. Vertigo is a symptom rather than a disease and may be helped a little by betony and fresh ginger, if persistent.

In the Prescription for Nutritional Healing (second edition) by James F. Balch, M.D. and Phyllis A. Balch, C.N.C. refers to it as a sensation of dizziness, faintings, or light-headedness, resulting from an impaired sense of balance and equilibrium. It's name comes from VERTE, the latin verb meaning "to turn," again usually due to an inner ear problem. A person with vertigo may feel they are falling or sinking and/or the room and objects in it are spinning, sometimes accompanied by nausea and hearing loss.

Vertigo occurs when the central nervous system receives conflicting messages from the inner ear, eyes, muscles, and skin pressure receptors. There are a variety of causes, including brain tumors, high blood pressure, or low blood pressure, allergies, head injuries, inadequate or interrupted supply of oxygen to the brain, anemia, viral infection, fever, the use of certain drugs, nutritional deficiencies, neurological disorders, psychological stress, atmospheric pressure changes, blockage in the ear canal or eustacian tube, middle ear infections, excess wax in the ear, poor cerebral circulation - due to either narrowing of blood vessels that supply the brain, pinched vessels in the neck, or a disorder such as anemia or diabetes. Because of the effects of aging on the body, it is believed that older people

are more prone than others to experience vertigo.

All B vitamins can help. B3 improves circulation and lowers cholesterol, B complex plus B6, and B12, are important for normal brain and central nervous system functions. Vitamins C and E improve circulation and are antioxidants. Brewer's yeast contains balanced B vitamins.

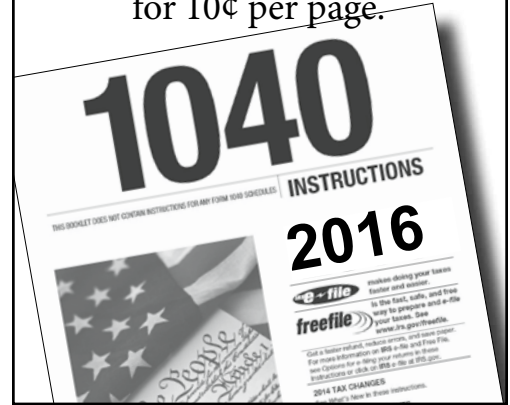
Calcium and magnesium are good for regular nerve impulses and help prevent dizziness. Kelp has balanced minerals and vitamins. Butcher's broom and cayenne improve circulation. Dandelion tea or extract are good for high blood pressure. Ginger relieves dizziness and nausea. Ginko Biloba improves circulation and brain function by increasing the supply of oxygen to the brain.

The P.D.R. For Herbal Medicines (Fourth Edition) lists these herbs as an aid for vertigo: Asiatic Dogwood, Behen, Cowslip, European Mistletoe, Feverfew, Fishberry, Ginko Biloba, Rosemary, Sweet Marjorum, Tansy, Taumellooch, and Wormwort - all of which may be beneficial for treating vertigo. I will start reporting on these herbs in my next article.

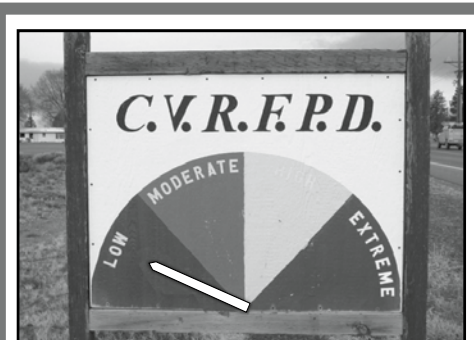

Tips on playing Christmas Valley Golf Course



Hole #1 - 163/153/119 Par 3

This hole is fairly easy, however the green has a decided pitch that makes 3-putting a constant danger. Beware of rolling off the right side as your lie may be difficult. Better to be short than over.

Hole #2 - 335/324/278 Par 4

Hole two deceives the eye. It is best to aim toward the black and white 150 yard pole and to be slightly right if anything. The green is elevated and somewhat terraced. The slope off the back of this green means going over will most likely present a difficult chip.

Hole #3 - 429/418/356 Par 4

A slight dogleg left into the middle of the fairway will provide an open approach to the green which while slightly elevated is again one which slopes off the back side making short a much better choice than long.

Hole #4 488/435/351 Par 5/4

This dogleg left requires an accurate drive with a second shot bringing you near the three-foot mounds in front of the green. Beware of the dry pond (aka flamingo habitat) on the left as this hazard demands one play by the rules. The green is somewhat elevated but quite level and should present many birdie opportunities.

Hole #5 - 201/191/169 Par 3

A fine one-shotter into the prevailing wind will reach the green. Birdies will be scarce due to the slope of the green.

Hole #6 - 577/514/451 Par 5

Two long and accurate shots to the point of the turn of this serious right dogleg will leave a nice approach to the elevated green. The risk is to take the second shot over the corner which is a wasteland of sand and sage almost to the green. The green slopes and putting must be accurate to get that circle on the score card.

Hole #7 - 386/335/267 Par 4

Although this is a straight-away hole, the cupped green and the large mound in front of the green make the hole more difficult than it appears from the teeing ground. The green is fairly level, making long puts doable.

Hole #8 - 362/354/302 Par 4

Although this is a short Par 4, its green is the most difficult to hold as it slopes away from the lie of shots and is protected by ten-foot mounds. Be happy with a par.

Hole #9 - 380/353/268 Par 4

A wasteland area divides the fairway near the 150 yardage and makes shots steered away from the lake to the left more difficult. Best to land out past the 150 pole and slightly left for the best approach.

Please note:

The entire right side of the course, with the exception of Hole #1 is out of bounds ten yards into the sage or when it is obvious your ball is on private property.

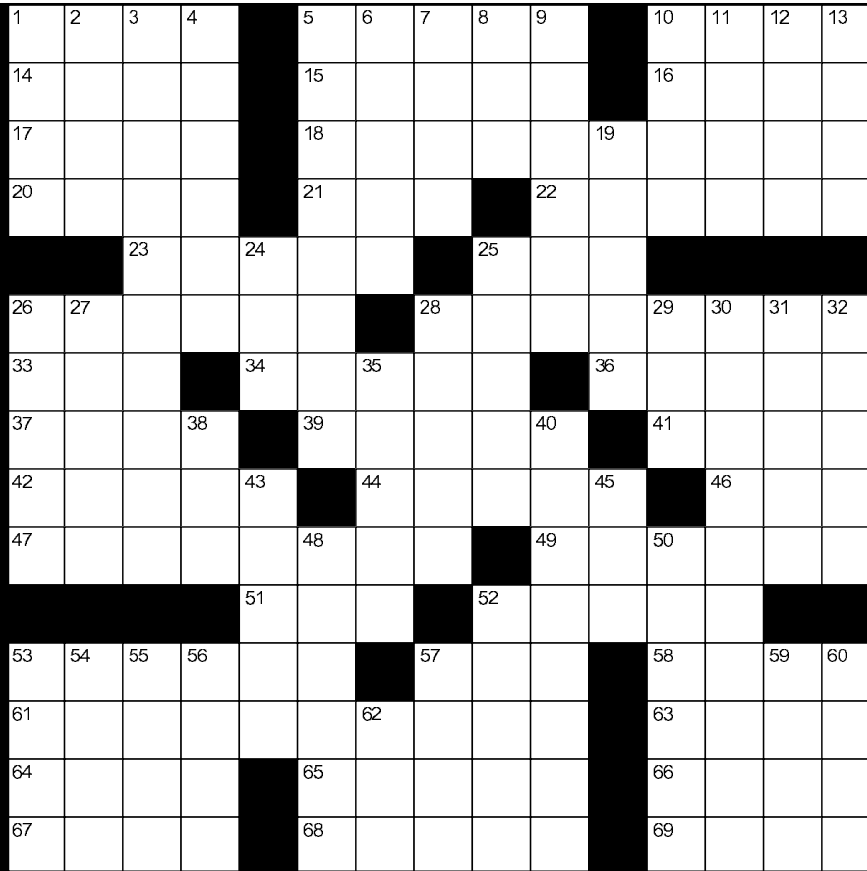


